



BOLD GOAL 1: Kindergarten Ready

100% of our children will enter kindergarten ready to learn.

- Engaged with school districts to support families, determine standards of kindergarten readiness and implement shared data collection
- Provided over 225 scholarships for high quality childcare and Pre-K
- Provided evidence-based best practices across school districts and Pre-K partnerships to develop consistent and aligned curriculum
- Expanded from half-day to full-day at specific Pre-K sites to better serve the needs of children and families
- Provided transportation for children to attend high quality Pre-K locations
- Served 20 home-based child care providers through Mentoring van and Be READy Rover
- Expanded high-quality Pre-K classrooms
- Provided evidence-based Incredible Beginnings and Incredible Years training to home-based child care providers and parents

BOLD GOAL 2: Educated for Success

100% of individuals will have post-secondary credentials.



- Provided 400 new arrivals with language acquisition and ESL classes
- Secured corporate sponsor to create jobs with sustainable living wage for program participants
- Piloted a navigator (person-centered) approach to help clients achieve self-sufficiency, financial stability, and workforce readiness skills
- Empowered program participants to pursue post-secondary credentials at HACC and Thaddeus Stevens College with scholarships or tuition waivers
- Purchased materials and resources to support adult learning: laptops, budgeting and career building software, SAT and GED prep software
- Provided professional development and resources for 20 home based child care providers
 - Established GED, ESL, and internship programs in multiple locations

BOLD GOAL 3: Out of Poverty

Decrease individuals and families living in poverty by 50%.

- Expanded accessibility to social services County-wide by creating access hubs in Pequea Valley, Solanco, and Elizabethtown
- Expanded healthy food distribution program for young children
- Implemented a county-wide pilot for individuals experiencing homelessness to receive rapid rehousing services
- Created a streamlined, single joint funding application for organizations serving people experiencing homelessness
- Enrolled new patients in co-pay assistance program-helping patients afford medical visit co-pays
- Shifted from crisis management to empowering survivors to attain skills and resources to become self-sufficient
- Increased VITA services by 23%
- Created community resource guide for individuals and families in Solanco



BOLD GOAL 4: Healthy Living

100% of individuals, children, and families will have a medical home.

- Served 1,000 patients at new medical clinic at Reynolds Middle School, a Full Service Community School
- Adopted a universal depression screening tool (PHQ-9) and began implementing the tool in nearly 80% of healthcare providers
- Integrated civil legal aid and financial case management-the first initiative of its kind in the nation-with an intensive health care treatment model for high utilizers
- Provided mental health first aid training to 633 individuals
- Hosted Mental Health Expo to connect community members with available services, providers, and resources related to behavioral health support
- Expanded school based behavioral health services to support additional parents and families in Pequea Valley
- Connected individuals and families with insurance options and medical home
- Expanded county-wide connections and resources among physical and behavioral health providers
